# VACCINATION SCHEDULE – AUTUMN 2024

RSV Vaccine (Respiratory Syncytial Virus) – is a common respiratory virus that usually causes mild, cold-like symptoms during the winter months. Babies <1 year and older adults are at greatest risk.

Can be administered **FROM 1/9/24**, and all year round from this point.

Eligible:-

- Older adults 75yrs 79yrs (the day before their 80<sup>th</sup> birthday) as of 31<sup>st</sup> August 2024
- Anyone turning 80 years in the first year i.e. from 2/9/24, who have until 31 August 2025 to get vaccinated
- Pregnant women (from 28 weeks) who remain eligible up to birth

Vaccine details – Abrysvo, PfizerPro UK

#### Influenza

Can be administered at different times this year based on patient's age and clinical condition. (this is a NHS England directive not a practice one)

Eligible:-

- Pregnant women from 1/9/24
- Children from 1/9/24
- From Thursday 3/10/2024

#### 1. Adults > 65 years (including those turning 65 on or before 31/3/25)

- 2. Adults in clinical risk group
- 3. Adult carers receiving carer's allowance or main carer for elderly or disabled
- 4. NHS Staff
- 5. Long stay Residential care home patients
- 6. Patients in close contact with immunocompromised individuals
- 7. Front line workers in social care without their own employer OH service.

#### Covid-19

Not given at the surgery

Can be administered for the Autumn 2024 season.

Eligible:-

- adults aged 65 years and over
- residents in a care home for older adults
- individuals aged 6 months to 64 years in a clinical risk group

#### Can vaccines be administered together?

No - Over 75's should have RSV separately from covid and flu, however no specific gap is advised – we recommend booking after two weeks. Covid and Flu can still be administered at the same appointment.

Petussis (whooping cough) & RSV for pregnant women need to be 2 weeks apart.
